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

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New Adult Learning Hub

The new Adult Carers learning Hub is a chance for carers to meet in a shared and supportive space and focus on the experiences, skills and learning they have developed while caring.

Many adult carers have told us that the role of an unpaid carer can lead to a feeling of isolation and that they can often find it difficult to focus on their own goals and outcomes. This group invites carers to share experiences and learning, while working through nationally registered accreditation and training opportunities.

The sessions are perfect for carers looking to build a CV, get back into education, volunteering, and employment or to work with other carers to focus on the knowledge and skills they have developed while caring. By the end of the sessions each carer will have had the opportunity to gain an SCQF accredited qualification, training certificates and a sense of peer-support from other carers who live in their community. The hub will run fortnightly until the spring of 2022 and takes place at the Brooksbank Centre, every 2nd Wednesday from 11am to 1.30pm

Vaccine Information for Unpaid Carers

The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) recommends that unpaid carers should be offered a coronavirus (COVID-19) booster vaccine to help increase their immunity level. Unpaid carers are also eligible for the free flu vaccine.

Who can register for the vaccinations?

Unpaid carers aged 16 and over providing face-to-face care can book online for coronavirus booster and flu vaccinations. Providing face-to-face care can be anything from preparing meals and helping with other household tasks to giving personal and practical support.

When can I receive my coronavirus booster?

Boosters can be given six months (24 weeks) after your second coronavirus vaccine dose. The flu vaccine can be given at any time. This means some people will be able to have their coronavirus booster and flu vaccine in one appointment and others will need two appointments. Only those who have had their first two doses of the coronavirus vaccine will be able to receive a booster. If you've not yet had your first or second dose, you should find out how to get it.

NHS Tayside CAMHS New Neurodevelopment Portal

Due to increased demand for Neurodevelopmental assessment there are now long waiting times.

We know this is frustrating and stressful for families and as a team we share that frustration and stress. We are working hard to improve our service to ensure that children are seen as quickly as we can.

We know that there is a need to provide immediate information and support, so funding has been sourced from the Community Wellbeing Fund across Tayside, to create an online Neurodevelopmental Portal for those families currently waiting to be seen by CAMHS Outpatient Service. The portal will be an interactive / self-directed resource of information, inclusive of support and guidance for families. The content will be delivered by local CAMHS Clinicians. Whilst diagnosis can be helpful, initial support does not need to wait for diagnosis.

Carers Partnership New Strategy - A Caring Dundee 2

A plan for supporting carers in Dundee 2021 - 2024

The Carers (Scotland) Act (2016) says every local area must have a Local Carers Strategy which is reviewed every 3 years.

A Local Carers Strategy is a plan made with Carers for Carers. In Dundee our new plan is 'A Caring Dundee 2'. This plan was written by the Dundee Carers Partnership and agreed by the Dundee Integration Joint Board (IJB) and Dundee City Council. The plan builds on the last plan 'A Caring Dundee 2017'.

The plan is for unpaid Carers who help someone of any age who needs help because of long term illness, disability, frailty or older age, mental health or alcohol or drug use. The person they help might be a partner or someone in their family or a friend. The Carers Strategy is not about people who care for others as part of their job or as a volunteer. A Carer may look after one person or more and a Carer can be an adult or a child. When a Carer is under 18, they are known as a Young Carer.

A 'Caring Dundee 2' has 4 Strategic Outcomes that will be used to organise the work. They are:

1. I am heard, recognised, respected and I am able to be involved.
2. I am supported to have the best possible caring experience.
3. I can live a full and healthy life
4. I can have a life of my own and I can balance the caring role in my life

Changes in Fire Alarm Legislation

The law on fire alarms is changing from February 2022 which means all Scottish homes will need to have interlinked alarms. Interlinked means if one goes off, they all go off, so you will always hear an alarm wherever you are in your home. The new law has come about because of the Grenfell fire in London in 2017, and it applies to all Scottish homes. It is the property owner's responsibility for meeting the new standard.

By February 2022 every home must have:

- one smoke alarm in the living room or the room you use most
- one smoke alarm in every hallway or landing
- one heat alarm in the kitchen

All smoke and heat alarms should be mounted on the ceiling and be interlinked. If you have a carbon-fuelled appliance – like a boiler, fire, heater, or flue – in any room, you must also have a carbon monoxide detector in that room, but this does not need to be linked to the fire alarms.

Help with costs

Older and disabled homeowners on low incomes can get help with costs and should contact Dundee Care and Repair on 01382 436895 for advice and help. If you are a private tenant, your landlord is responsible. If you are a council or housing association tenant, work is ongoing to make sure your home meets the new standards.
