Dundee International Women's Centre -



- Any woman in Dundee can come to the centre and make use of the facilities. We offer social and educational classes Monday – Thursday, and we're open 9am– 3pm.
- Our 'Cosy Space' is open from 10am, and women don't need to be members to stay in the centre and use the WiFi, stay warm during winter, or meet their friends.
 Friendship Group-Tuesdays 1pm-2.45pm
- Discover Dundee- Wednesdays
 10am-12pm- Outings, walks, exploring Dundee.
- We offer lunch on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The price for this is currently £1.50 and £2.50
 respectively, and 50p for children. Menus are posted on Facebook every week and we ask that anyone wanting lunch (to eat in the centre or takeaway) books at Reception the day before.



- Membership runs for one year and costs £6 (for anyone wanting to join in classes). Everyone joining pays £6 and then we ask members to renew on 1st September the following year. There is no referral system, and no need to book an appointment to see the centre. I am always on the front desk and can show new members around the centre and answer any questions.
- Men are welcome to come along with women for a visit (such as husbands or sons) but we ask that they do not stay in the centre during a class or lunch club
- Social classes (like cooking or sewing) are drop-in sessions and don't require booking.
- Educational classes (like English or NPA) require an appointment with our English teachers for an assessment to make sure they are at the correct level.

Creche

- We have an in-house creche which accepts children of any age up to 16.
- This is open to any child in Dundee, and parents / carers don't have to be a member of DIWC to use it.

- Spaces are limited, so we require booking in advance, and cancellation if not able to attend.
- This service is currently free.
